## **Prisons Overcrowding**

At a recent meeting co-chaired by my Minister and Hon. Tiran Alles, Minister of Public Security to address the issue of prison overcrowding, it was decided to make the following requests from the Judicial Service Commission.

- Not to mention the name of the prison/ rehabilitation centre when courts give orders for rehabilitation, so that the Commissioner General of Prisons can decide the location of the prison/ rehabilitation center depending on the available space.
- Consider limiting the period of rehabilitation to six months (The Commissioner General of Bureau of Rehabilitation, confirmed that the effectiveness of the vocational training is found to be only 4%)
- The Department of Community Based Corrections has informed that they have the capacity to handle more convicts than are presently referred. Therefore, it was decided to request that Community Based Corrections orders be made in respect of more convicts than at present, as appropriate.

Therefore, I shall be grateful if you could inform the above to the Commission.
